EMSB ethics watchdog busy

IN 2 YEARS School board has spent 'around \$32,000' to deal with 13 complaints against commissioners

When the English Montreal School Board appointed Jennifer Madelaine Lemire as its first ethics commissioner, it hired her on as-needed basis to examine and rule on

complaints filed against the board's elected commissioners.

The politically turbulent school board sure has needed her services.

Thirteen ethics complaints against EMSB commissioners have been filed since Lemire

was named in May 2007, The Gazette has learned.

Two complaints were against Lemire personally; the rest were filed by commissioners.

The EMSB says it has spent "around \$32,000" to date for Lemire to deal with the complaints. That amount con-

trasts sharply with what several area school boards have spent during the same time frame, according to Lemire.

Anne-Marie Mancini, the EMSB's chairperson, said she wasn't aware of all the complaints because they go directly to the ethics commissioner.

Many were lodged over a year ago and haven't been looked at yet, Mancini said.

"I think it's important to do with more transparency."

Several commissioners declined to explain why they filed complaints against an-

other commissioner or why they were the object of them.

"I think I worry more about the costs associated with this," said Mancini, rather than how the situation looks for her board.
